Majeski will also conduct the P.M. Pollinators program that will include a 1½-mile hike to look for moths and other nighttime insects. Bring a flashlight. The program will be from 8-9:30 p.m. July 11.

The weekend programs will conclude with a one mile Pollinators Power Hike to seek out the hardest workers in nature from 9-10:30 a.m. July 12.
